KTC Community Improvement Grant Fund Guidelines

Maximum Amount Allowed per Grant: \$500.00/quarter

Grant Awards will be determined by the Kingdom Telephone Board of Directors. Priority funding will be given to projects that benefit the largest percentage of your community members. Those projects might include: developing public libraries, aiding ambulance and fire districts, constructing community buildings, etc.
